An international competition of digital video projects with two sections: **"Booktrailers"** and **"Documentaries"** There are no participation fees.

What do you need to do?

You need to create a short videoclip in which you present your **personal perspective** on either a **literary work** (BOOKTRAILER) or a **scientific subject** (DOCUMENTARY). Only individual projects / creations are accepted (no group work).



Demonstrate your creativity and expressivity, especially your digital content creator skills!

There are only three compulsory elements for either 'booktrailers' or 'documentaries'. The videoclips submitted:

1. must be between 1:30 and 3:30 / 4:30 minutes long.

2. must have a **narrative (voiceover) in one language and subtitles in another language**. The languages accepted are (in no particular order): English, French, German, Italian, Spanish.

3. must include in the video (at the end) **credits**, that is, a list of all sources used for the imagery, sound, sound effects, music, software, apps, etc.

What's in it for you?

Each participating student will receive a **digital certificate** listing all skills and key competences demonstrated by their video creations. We will use as references the "8 key competences", (<u>https://education.ec.europa.eu/focus-topics/improving-quality/key-competences</u>), "DigComp" (<u>https://publications.jrc.ec.europa.eu/repository/handle/JRC128415</u>), "LifeComp" (<u>https://joint-research-centre.ec.europa.eu/lifecomp-conceptual-reference-model_en</u>). Students can add these certificates to their **personal portfolios /** learning diaries.

How will projects be evaluated?

ALERT: First, make sure your project respects the three compulsory elements:

- 1) Length: **1:30 3:30 minutes** (*length constraint is an evaluation criterion*)
- 2) Audio/ Subtitles: the videoclip must be **narrated in one language** and **subtitled in another language**.
- 3) Credits: the videoclip must **present the sources used**, <u>including royalty free ones</u> (audio/video/images, etc)

\rightarrow **Booktrailers**: evaluation criteria & points awarded

A) Length constraint is respected (booktrailers must be between 1:30 and 3:30 minutes long); the videoclip is narrated in one language and subtitled in a different language; the videoclip includes credits (it acknowledges the sources used, including royalty free ones) – **25 points**

B) Coherence of the cinematographic story (easy to follow sequencing of ideas, visual representations adequate to the tone/style of the plot, subtitles match the narrative, etc) – **50 points**

C) Expressivity (the imagery is consistent throughout, images are suggestive and relevant, special effects – if any – are used appropriately, transition techniques do not affect the viewer's experience, music – if any – does not interfere with the message) – **25 points**

→ What titles? Students can submit a booktrailer for any work of fiction included in the school curricula. They can also choose to present a novel, novella or short story which is not part of the curriculum, but it is a work of fiction they particularly enjoyed.

Each participating school can provide students with *a list of suggested titles*.



\rightarrow **Documentaries**: "How to ..." / "What is ...": evaluation criteria & points awarded

1) Length constraint is respected ('Documentaries' can be between 1:30 and 4:30 minutes long); the videoclip is narrated in one language and subtitled in a different language; the videoclip includes credits (it acknowledges the sources used, including royalty free ones) – 25 points

2) Coherence of the story (easy to follow sequencing of ideas, visual representations adequate to the topic, subtitles match the narrative, etc) – **50 points**

3) Expressivity (images are suggestive and relevant, special effects – if any – are used appropriately, transition techniques do not affect the viewer's experience, music – if any – does not interfere with the message) – **25 points**

 \rightarrow Each participating school can provide students with a list of suggested topics in the fields of sciences.
